

GARDEN FARMER™ MULTI-BUDDED FRUIT TREES

The Multi-Budded Fruit Tree is like having a fruit basket growing in your backyard! When the Multi-Budded Fruit Tree was about two months old, several varieties of fruit were budded to it. These varieties include different combinations of peach, apricot, plum and nectarine. A mature Splash tree will grow a combination of peaches, apricots, nectarines and plums all on one tree. There are also Cherry, Apple, Peach and Plum Multi-Budded trees offering several varieties within its own species. Early and late ripening varieties have been selected so you can be picking fruit all season long!

5-in-1 Peach Party

Varieties may include:

O'Henry Freestone Peach - Ripens early August. Large, firm fruit with good flavor. 750 Hours

Giant Babcock White Flesh Peach - Ripens late July. Produces large sweet fruit. 500 Hours

Fantasia Nectarine - Ripens mid July. A large, attractive, sweet nectarine. 500 Hours

Snow Queen Nectarine - Ripens late June. White, sweet and juicy fruit. 275 Hours

5-in-1 Fruit Splash Tree

Varieties may include:

Santa Rosa Plum - Ripens mid-July. Large Fruit with purple skin & yellow flesh. Excellent flavor. Good Producer. Very Popular 300 hours

Fantasia Nectarine - Ripens mid July. A Large, attractive, sweet nectarine. 500 Hours

Patterson Apricot - Ripens late June. Medium size firm fruit with good flavor. 600 Hours

Fay Elberta Peach - Ripens mid July. Large tasty, firm peach. 750 Hours

Halford Cling Peach - Ripens late August. Produces large, firm fruit. Good eating and canning qualities. 800r

4-in-1 Wacky Apple

Varieties may include:

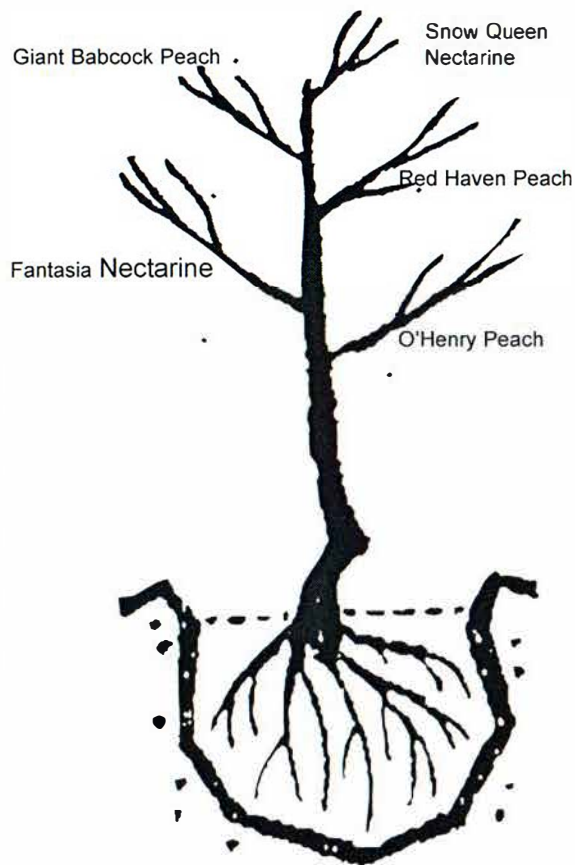
Granny Smith Apple- White fleshed, green apple, sweet tart flavor 600 Hours

Gala-Red stripped apple, yellow flesh, sweet caramel flavor. 650 Hours

Fuji-Red stripped apple, very sweet, large fruit. 300 Hr.

Golden Delicious-Yellow apple, creamy white flesh. 700 Hours

ALL TREES REQUIRE CHILLING HOURS
Below 45 degrees and above 32 degrees
to produce fruit

Your tree will be delivered in its dormant state. Keep roots moist. Try to plant as soon as possible. Select a site that has good drainage. Dig hole deep enough so as not to crowd roots. Do not plant tree deeper than when it was in the bag. Fill hole with dirt and pack firmly to prevent air pockets from forming. Watering by soaking the tree is preferred over sprinkling.

4-in-1 Cherry Bomb

Varieties may include:

Bing - Ripens mid July. Large, firm, juicy dark red, excellent eating cherry. 700 Hours

Rainier - Ripens just ahead of Bing. Produces large, yellow fruit of exceptional flavor. 700 Hours

Black Tartarian - Used as a pollinator. Produces small, soft fruit. 700 Hours

Lapin - Ripens about two weeks after Bing. Large, deep red fruit with excellent firmness and flavor 800 Hours

5-in-1 Plum Blast

Varieties may include:

Santa Rosa Plum - ripens mid July. Purple skin and yellow flesh. Very Popular. 300 Hours

Kelsey Plum - Ripens mid July. Has Green Skin and good flavor. 400 Hours

Sugar Plum - Ripens late August. Very large dark purple fruit. Yellow Flesh. Great eating 550 Hours

Catalina Plum - Ripens early July. Medium size, dark purple fruit. Yellow flesh with good sweet flavor. 400 Hr

OR

Elephant Heart - Ripens early July. Very large fruit with mottled purple skin. Blood red flesh. Excellent flavor. 500 Hours

5-in-1 Apricot Blitz

Varieties may include:

Patterson - Large firm fruit, very sweet when ripe. Very good for canning and drying. Ripens late June. 600 Hours

Royal Blenheim - All-purpose freestone, sweet, aromatic, and flavorful. Ripens late June. 500 Hours

Moorepark - Large semi-soft fruit, very juicy and sweet. Mid season harvest. 600 hours

Westley - Medium to large fruit; good fresh or preserved. Ripens early July.

Lorna - Large fruit. firm, fine, textured flesh. Ripens late May. Freestone. 425 Hours
